

When is Christmas Day?

On this day, over two billion people (over a third of the world's population) will celebrate the birth of Christ.

Whilst the holiday has a strong grounding in the story of the birth of Jesus, many of the traditions we associate with Christmas have evolved from pre-Christian beliefs and certainly, the traditions have evolved beyond purely a Christian holiday to have a wider significance.

The celebration of Christmas in late December is certainly as a result of pre-existing celebrations happening at that time, marking the Winter Solstice.

Most notable of these is Yule (meaning 'Feast'), a winter pagan festival that was originally celebrated by Germanic people. The exact date of Yule depends on the lunar cycle but it falls from late December to early January.



Several Yule traditions are familiar to the modern celebration of Christmas, such as Yule Log, the custom of burning a large wooden log on the fire at Christmas; or indeed carol singing, which is surprisingly a very ancient tradition.

Christmas Traditions

Mistletoe

Kissing someone who happens to be stood under a sprig of mistletoe is seen as a tradition popularised in Victorian England. However even this relatively modern tradition has much more ancient echoes in that Mistletoe bears its fruit around the time of the Winter Solstice, and it's supposed mythical ability to heal and increase fertility.

In Norse mythology, an arrow made from mistletoe killed Balder, who was a brother of Thor. Frigga, Balder's mother brought him back to life shedding tears that changed the red berries on mistletoe to white. Frigga then blessed the mistletoe and promised a kiss to anyone who passed beneath it.

A hint of Mistletoe's integration from pagan ceremonies into Christmas tradition is said that the mistletoe plant used to be a tree, and its wood was used to make the cross on which Jesus was crucified. After the Crucifixion, the plant shrivelled to became the parasitic vine we know today.

Carol Singing

The tradition of singing of songs can be traced back to the pagan festivals before the advent of Christmas. Indeed, the word carol is derived from the Greek word "choraulein", which meant "an ancient circle dance performed to flute music."

As carols were already an established custom, early Christians made the shrewd decision to integrate Christian songs into the tradition rather than ban the singing.

Carols received an injection of popularity when St. Francis of Assisi started his Nativity Plays in Italy in 1223, which included songs written in the local people's language.

The tradition of 'Modern' Carol singing flourished in England. Known as Wassailing, it was a chance for peasants to get some much-needed charity from their feudal lords. This singing for money developed in a custom involving travelling musicians who would visit wealthy homes, singing in the hope of receiving money food or gifts in return.

There was a short interruption in 1647 when the Puritans come to power after the English Civil War. The Puritans, under the leadership of Oliver Cromwell, disapproved of the celebration of Christmas. There was even a fine of up to five shillings for anyone caught singing Christmas carols. When King Charles II came back to the throne in 1660, the public singing of Christmas carols was permitted

again.

Christmas Customs in Spain



24th December marks the beginning of Pascuas de Navidad in Spain. It is a period of celebration that continues until 6th January.

However, for many, the Christmas holidays begin on 22nd December the Loteria de Navidad takes place. Known as El Gordo ('the fat one'), it's the biggest lottery in the world, with 98% of the population participating. It has a total payout of nearly \$3 billion, with a 1 in 6.5 chance of winning a prize, which range from 20 euros to 400,000 euros.

A traditional feature of the televised Christmas draw is the participation of students from Madrid's San Ildefenso school. Every time a numbered ball is drawn, two uniformed schoolchildren sing the ball's number and the corresponding prize amount.

Sometimes it is good to look back and reflect on successes, failures and achievements as we come to end of the year. We think we have made some real progress in the last 6 months. We have a regular working party of between 7 and 14 dedicated and reliable helpers now who all pitch in with cleaning, grooming and feeding. The animals are all looking happy and healthy. 




The Official Christmas Number 1s

Versions of charity smash Do They Know It's Christmas? have topped the charts on 25 December three times: for Band Aid in 1984, Band Aid II in 1989, and finally for Band Aid 20 in 2004.

The first version of Do They Know It's Christmas? is the biggest selling Christmas Number 1 of all time, with over 3.8 million copies sold.

Mary's Boy Child has been a Christmas Number 1 twice for totally different artists.

Harry Belafonte topped the charts with it in 1957 and Boney M took a one-horse open sleigh all the way to Number 1 with it (mashed up with Oh my Lord) in 1978.



The only song to get the Christmas Number 1 twice by the same artist is Bohemian Rhapsody by Queen.

It first topped the Christmas charts in 1975 and pulled it off again 16 years later, following the death of Queen frontman Freddie Mercury.

As a result, it is one of the longest-reigning Number 1 hits of all-time.

Last, but by no means least, are the novelty singles. 2019 and 2018 both saw YouTuber LadBaby claim the Christmas top spot with sausage roll-themed singles, both in aid of food band charity The Trussell Trust.



Going back, Bob The Builder claimed a Christmas Number 1 in 2000 with Can We Fix It?, as did Mr Blobby with his self-titled debut single in 1993.

FAST needs more volunteers to enable us to provide the valuable life saving service. It has been more than 16 months since we were responding in person. As regulations ease we may be able to resume our valuable service by responding in person.

FAST have been back on active responding since the end of October. Our primary concern is for our Responders who may attend people's homes. We are all instructed by our accredited trainers that we first look for danger. One new form of danger for us now is the Covid 19 virus. When a call is made to FAST one of the questions you will be asked is "have you been vaccinated against the Corona virus"? Depending on the answer our response may be modified to not only protect the responders but the wider public. We will be available to give advice if the caller has any symptoms of the virus. On days when we cannot respond in person we are able to give advice over the phone.

We have 5 new recruits. Covid restrictions and protocols were observed and adhered to during their training. The new recruits all passed their examinations, theory and practical. They will be accompanied for a while by an experienced responder. We are planning another new recruits course for December, so if you would like to be a responder please come along on a Tuesday morning to the Cultural Centre and see what we do. You will be made most welcome. Training is free to the responder, the Murcian Health Authority recognise the standard of training.

If you have a medical emergency first call 112. Ask for an operator to speak in your language if you do not speak Spanish. They will ask a series of questions in order to prioritise the call. Then call FAST on 868 487 015. The FAST responders will also ask some questions and attend your location as quickly as possible. If the call is at night, we ask the caller to put outside lights on to assist us finding the address. This will also help the Emergency services to find the location.

When FAST responders attend an emergency we can stop catastrophic bleeding, ensure the casualty has an open airway and if required give lifesaving CPR. Both the FAST vehicles are fully equipped with Defibrillators, blood clotting type bandages and all the other kit required of a first responder. We also comfort the other members of the household; give advice on what

the medics will want to see when they arrive. Also if the patient has to stay in hospital we have a list of things they may need for a hospital stay.

If you are feeling depressed or just need to speak to a trained responder regarding your state of mind then call the Mental Health Line on 634 308 362. Our trained Mental Health responders are available 24 hours a day to support the people of Camposol and Saladillo.

FAST would like to thank Betty and Lloyd Roberts for organising the quiz at the Golf club on the 4th November in aid of 3 charities on Camposol, FAST, MABS and Age Concern. Over €900 was raised on the night.

Members of the FAST supporter team organised a trip to Gibraltar in late October. It was a great few days enjoyed by all. Special thanks to Jenny Clive and Annie Hamilton. We have also had personal donations from Bernie Mac and Julia. We would also like to thank Debbie Shaw for always supporting FAST.

Central Heating in The Costa Cálida

Many people are under the misconception that Spain is hot and sunny all year round which is simply not true. Temperatures can range from plus 40 degrees in the height of the summer, but can drop below zero in the winter months. Clearly this varies from region to region but the winter nights can be very cold, especially from November until Easter with wind chill factors bringing icy winds from the mountains.

In most rural areas it is unlikely that you will find access to mains gas, however some urbanisations do offer a piped gas system which performs in the same way, except the supply comes from a bulk storage gas tank. For those of us that do no have this option, the most common solution is oil fired central heating.

Following a very unpleasant, cold and damp Christmas visit in a rented villa on sector A in 2001, we decided immediately that we would install central heating in our own villa especially as the plan was to come and live and work in Camposol.

Kevin Hicks is a qualified heating engineer from the U.K and already had his own business installing and maintaining oil, and gas heating systems in domestic, commercial and the industrial sectors.

Once our own installation was completed and proven, all the neighbours who had come to be resident, immediately requested the same, so we decided to invest in setting up the business.

Camposol Heating & Maintenance S.L was born in 2004, and is dedicated to supplying central heating and air conditioning to our clients. We have always offered a range of plumbing services too, including leak detection and repair, as well as back up water deposit systems for those with an unreliable water supply.

There are times when we will install smaller, LPG heating systems, especially in apartments, or small properties with no space for an oil tank, but for now, oil is still the preferred solution. We only work with major suppliers and have long

standing relationships with Baxi Roca, Junkers, as well as many local parts suppliers. We can also offer hot and cold air conditioning which is also an option for heating but it does not help with a hot water supply.

- Will all my heating pipework be in copper as it must be, not in cheaper, plastic alternatives?
- Do they come back to service my system after they have sold it to me?
- Do we have the choice of towel rails or radiators in the bathrooms?
- Can we turn off individual radiators in certain rooms when not being used?
- Can we have UK Style convection radiators as they are the most efficient and have the highest output?
- Will the project plan be agreed in advance with the customer?
- Do we get to choose where our radiators will go and where our oil tank and boiler will be placed?
- Can I control the room temperatures from inside the property?
- Can I pay for the whole system once completed, and not pay anything in advance?

Some of these questions may appear a little surprising but we have 16 years of experience installing these systems here in Spain, and we have come across "other systems" that simply do not offer what we do so please make sure any quotes you obtain are "like for like".

What to do sow and grow in December



There's plenty to keep you busy in the garden in December. Make the most of any crisp dry days to nip outside and get a head start on the new year.

Here are our top picks of seasonal flowers, plants, fruit and veg to sow and grow in the garden this month:

Plants and flowers to sow and grow



Here are the plants and flowers to sow and grow this December:

In the greenhouse/indoors

- Sow antirrhinums (Snapdragons) and laurentia in a cool greenhouse now for early flowering in the summer.
- Sow begonia and geranium seeds for a head start to the season.
- Hyacinth prefer cooler temperatures so sow
- them anytime between now and February for optimum growth.

Plants outdoors



- Plant up winter containers with fritillaria, ivy, skimmia and evergreen grasses such as Carex to add colour to your garden. Position them beside entrances and well used paths for a cheerful winter display.
- Plant bulbs in large pots of compost ready to fill any gaps in spring borders.
- Plant some shrubs for winter interest. Sarcococca confusa adds colour and fragrance

- to your garden at this time of year.
- If you still haven't planted your tulip bulbs there is still time, provided the ground isn't frozen.
- Plant bare-root native hedges to encourage wildlife and create attractive boundaries around your garden.
- Plant bare-root colourful hedging to add a splash of colour to your boundaries.
- Plant bare-root fast growing hedging, for natural, private boundaries around your garden that establish in virtually no time at all. Or for slower, more manageable hedging that doesn't require much pruning, try out our range of slow growing hedging.
- Take stock of any winter-flowering annuals in your garden, and make note which ones were successes for growing next year.

Herbs and vegetables to sow and grow

Here's what to sow and grow in the vegetable garden this December:

In the greenhouse/indoors

- Herbs such as basil, dill, chives and mint can be sown indoors on your windowsill for winter use.
- Sow winter hardy salad leaves under cover, such as lettuce 'Winter Gem' and 'Arctic King'
- Sow exhibition onion seeds now to give the bulbs time to grow as big as possible.

Plant outdoors

 Plant Rhubarb crowns now in well prepared soil. Add plenty of organic matter — they're hungry feeders!

Fruit to sow and grow

Try starting to grow these fruits this month:

- If you'd like to grow your own delicious raspberries next year, plant raspberry canes now while they're dormant.
- Plant blackberries any time between now and the spring.
- Strawberry plants can be planted now for a crop of sweet berries in the summer.
- Plant blueberries this winter for an attractive addition to the fruit garden. With pretty white flowers, delicious berries and fiery autumn foliage, these acid loving plants provide constant interest.
- Plant gooseberries and currants now.





Mazda MX-5



In February 1989 at the Chicago Auto Show, Mazda pulled the wraps off a lightweight, affordable sports car that would go on to be the biggest-selling two-seater convertible in history.

Powered by a 1.6-litre inline four cylinder engine putting out 114bhp at 6500rpm, enabling a 0-60mph dash in 9.1sec and topping out at 114mph, the MX-5 was never about searing page.

A two-seat roadster that car enthusiasts have been screaming for since the demise of the old Lotus Elan. It also has the two ingredients essential in any sports car powerplant: instant throttle response and an invigorating exhaust note." The real ace up the MX-5's sleeve proved to be its five-speed manual gearbox. Rising no more than a couple of inches from the transmission tunnel, the well-weighted gear lever snaps through its tiny throws with millimetric precision. Allied to pin-sharp handling and spectacular balance to flaunt its 950kg kerb weight, it allowed the driver plenty of midcorner adjustability.

In 1997, the second-generation MX-5 arrived, sans pop-up headlights of the original – due to safety regulations – and with an extra 115kg of mass due to its sleeker look. The 1.6-litre unit was joined by a new 140bhp 1.8-litre motor to counteract the extra bulk, enabling 0-62mph in 7.8sec and a top speed of 130mph.



That model was a sales smash. Throughout its life, the second-generation received a facelift and more kit. The output of both the 1.6- and the 1.8-litre engines were boosted and buyers could enjoy a six-speed manual gearbox.

Seven years later, the third-generation Mazda MX-5 was unleashed at the 2005 Geneva motor show, having undergone a complete overhaul. Penned by Yasushi Nakamuta and overseen by Moray Callum (yes, lan's brother), it boasted a more aggressive look with flared wheel arches while still harking back to the original design. Suspension changed from a four-wheel double wishbone setup to a front wishbone/rear multilink setup. The 1.6-litre lump was dropped in

favour of an entry-level 1.8-litre motor, while the flagship 2.0-litre engine developed 158bhp and was now available with a six-speed manual gearbox. The MX-5 would receive an all-new fourth-generation version in 2014, with Mazda's KODO design language influencing its look and shape. It arrived with a choice of 1.5 or 2.0-litre engines that both used Mazda's Skyactiv fuel-saving technology, and weighed around 100kg less than the car it replaced. A lower centre of gravity helped it recapture some of the dynamic flair many thought was missing from the third-generation car.

Throughout its life the Mazda MX-5 has built itself a huge fan base, thanks to its ease of use, affordability and low running costs. It's proven popular in many forms of motorsport, and even been subject to a host of aftermarket conversions - including V8 engine swaps and forced induction systems. The latest MX-5 remains a true testament to the original, combining jawdropping looks with a low kerb weight and nimble driving style. As for the future? Mazda is reportedly considering its options, with a hybrid or even fully electric powertrain for its fifth generation.

Alonso delighted to end F1 podium drought after "waiting so long"




Fernando Alonso has described his return to the Formula 1 podium for the first time in over seven years as "unbelievable". Alonso finished on the podium for the first time since the 2014 Hungarian Grand Prix after he beat Red Bull's Sergio Perez to finish third in Qatar. Alpine's one-stop strategy worked beautifully as Perez ran out of laps to catch and overtake the Spaniard.

"Yeah, unbelievable," he said. "Seven years and finally we got it. We were close a couple of races but not enough. Sochi was the last possibility and yeah today [we did it]."

The two-time F1 champion started the race from third, moving up two spots on the grid due to grid penalties for Max Verstappen and Valtteri Bottas.

F1 Qatar GP: Lewis Hamilton dominates to close on F1 title rival Max Verstappen

Lewis Hamilton claimed victory at the inaugural Qatar Grand Prix to close in on Formula 1 title rival Max Verstappen in the championship, as the Red Bull driver recovered to second. Hamilton led from start to finish with a commanding drive to convert pole position into his seventh victory of the season to further cut Verstap-



pen's championship advantage with his second consecutive win. A superb start helped Verstappen overcome a five-place grid penalty for failing to respect double waved yellow flags in qualifying as the Dutchman charged from seventh to second in just five laps. While Verstappen was never really in contention to challenge Hamilton, he importantly took the fastest lap bonus point to hold an eight-point championship lead heading into the final two rounds.

PEDRO ACOSTA THE MAZARRÓN SHARK

In Puerto de Mazarrón there is a fisherman who goes out every night to fish the Mediterranean



in Murcian waters. Meanwhile, his son has left the world speechless being Moto3 world champion. There's no one like him. He is the first to get on the podium in his first four world races. The first in all of MotoGP history. Nobody, not Rossi, not Márquez, not Hailwood, not Agostini, not Angel Nieto, had done it before.

In Portimao, during the Algarve GP, Acosta achieved his sixth victory and became Moto3 world champion. It is easy to imagine a bright future for "the Mazarrón shark", but the road was much darker. Acosta's dream is that of a whole humble family that has fought for the young pilot to get to where he is. Pedro Acosta was born on May 25, 2004, and in 2013 he is already winning Mini Speed races. During the following season, at the age of 10, he became the RAV 140cc Spanish champion, and in 2015 he won the Cuna de Campeones, the Spanish Cup, the Murcian Championship and the Levante Cup.

A year later he was proclaimed runner-up in the Spanish GP 220 4t XL Mini Speed Cup and achieved the same result in the same category of the Cuna de Campeones. During that season, he also completed a comeback that years later we would see him repeat.

Acosta's progression was stratospheric and that led him to make his FIM CEV Repsol debut with the Swiss Innovative Investors team in 2018, when he was just 13 years old. Despite



the efforts of the team, whose structure reached the world championship with Iker Lecuona, the financial problems that had plagued Acosta since its inception reappeared. He was left without equipment and without options. But he never stopped training. In 2019, everything changed. From having nothing, to winning three races, making five podiums, and being runnerup without having participated in the first two rounds of the Red Bull Rookies Cup. Those numbers helped him to return to the FIM CEV Repsol, where he participated in the last five races with the Andreas Pérez 77 Foundation team. After a year where motorcycling gave him back what it took from him in 2018, the 2020 season was the confirmation of what was to come. The Murcian won the first six races of the Rookies Cup, stood on the podium in three more appointments, and was proclaimed champion with 64 points ahead of David Muñoz. That same year he also took third place in the FIM

The "Mazarrón shark", a nickname coined by Jordi Alberola. Thinking about winning from the pitlane, overtaking drivers two by two, starting a championship by sweeping or adapting to difficulties is in his DNA.

Acosta's style is born very close to his home, in the KSB Sport driving center in Cartagena. There, without driving on large circuits, moving in a few square meters and with a handful of cones.

The young man from Murciadoes not hesitate to go when he has the opportunity, to help and support his mentor. Thus, he collaborates with the person to whom, he says, he owes everything.

And it is that Acosta does not forget those who have pushed him when not everything was so beautiful. For this reason, every weekend, the Murcian visits his mechanics in the Red Bull Rookies Cup, in another show of gratitude.

Perhaps thanks to those demanding training sessions, Acosta manages to save falls that seem safe, as he did in the last lap of Portugal or two laps from the end in the Spanish Grand Prix, in Jerez. On both occasions he was close to falling, but the handling he shows on the bike helped him to lift it and stay on it, something that he also trains.

As he adds successes, the media, networks and people talk more and more about him. The young pilot admits that he prefers "not to read anything." At the beginning of the 2021 course, the opinions that were expressed about him began to take a toll on his psychological stability, so he decided to move away from social networks and the media. Like the most classic motorcycling, in its renewed version: think about

riding, riding and riding. Nothing more

Now he is surprising locals and strangers in the Moto3 World Championship. In his genes are the work, dedication and patience that make a good fisherman. But at their destination there are no ships, no fish, no ports; there are motorcycles, circuits and a very promising future.

Valentino Rossi named MotoGP™ Legend



The nine-time World Champion goes from legend to Legend with one final surprise in Valencia

Already a legend, Valentino Rossi (Petronas Yamaha SRT) has been inducted into the MotoGP™ Hall of Fame and is now an official MotoGP™ Legend! The nine-time World Champion was surprised with the honour at the FIM MotoGP™ Awards Ceremony, adding to a roll call of celebrations throughout the day as he hangs up his racing leathers.



The emotional lap of honour after the race and hero's welcome were only the start on Sunday, and those came after a weekend already painted yellow in the number 46's honour. Dorna CEO Carmelo Ezpeleta presented Rossi with the MotoGPTM Legend award on the stage, celebrating 26 seasons of history made and hearts captured around the world.

Nine World Championships, 115 wins and 235 podiums across all classes are incredible numbers, but the legend is even more than those.

The Italian joins a long list of greats that have been made MotoGP™ Legends that includes Giacomo Agostini, Mick Doohan, Geoff Duke, Wayne Gardner, Mike Hailwood, Daijiro Kato, Eddie Lawson, Anton Mang, Angel Nieto, Wayne Rainey, Phil Read, Jim Redman, Kenny Roberts, Jarno Saarinen, Kevin Schwantz, Barry Sheene, Marco Simoncelli, Freddie Spencer, Casey Stoner, John Surtees, Carlo Ubbiali, Alex Crivillé, Franco Uncini, Marco Lucchinelli, Randy Mamola, Kork Ballington, Dani Pedrosa,



Stefan Dörflinger, Jorge 'Aspar' Martinez and the late, great Nicky Hayden.

Valentino Rossi, MotoGP™ Legend: "I always think of this day like a nightmare, because it's the end of a long career and I thought it would be in Valencia but in the end I enjoyed it a lot so I have to thank everyone, everyone who has worked with me, the whole paddock, the other riders... it was an unforgettable day and I enjoyed it. It was a long career, and always a pleasure."



Valentino Rossi born 16 February 1979 is an Italian former professional motorcycle road racer. Nicknamed The Doctor, he has won premier class World Championships with both Yamaha and Honda.

He is widely considered to be one of the greatest motorcycle racers of all time, with nine Grand Prix World Championships to his name – seven of which are in the premier class. He is also the only road racer to have competed in 400 or more Grands Prix.

He has ridden with number 46 his entire career. He also owns the Sky Racing Team VR46, which currently participates in the Moto2 class and historically in the Moto3 class. He became a MotoGP Legend after his retirement in 2021.




The Los Amigos weekly meetings are currently held at Mariano's Bar & Restaurant (Camposol A) each Thursday at 4 pm.





The Perfect Christmas Turkey



Ingredients

- 20ml/¾fl oz rapeseed oil
- 1 x 5kg/11lb good-quality turkey, wishbone removed (ask your butcher to remove the wings and neck and chop them into 2.5cm/1in pieces to use in the dish)
- 40g/1½oz unsalted butter, softened to room temperature
- 2 pinches sea salt flakes
- 2 pinches freshly ground white pepper
- 200ml/7fl oz water
- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 1-2 tsp ground corn flour dissolved in 1 tbsp cold water
- roast potatoes and steamed seasonal vegetables

Method

- Bring the Turkey to room temperature this will take at least an hour.
- Preheat the oven to 230C/220C Fan/Gas
 8.
- Heat the rapeseed oil in a large roasting tray on the stove. Add the chopped turkey wings and neck and fry for 8-10 minutes, turning the pieces until browned all over.
- Soften the butter with the back of a dessert spoon, season with salt and freshly ground white pepper. Smear the seasoned butter all over the turkey.
- Place the turkey on top of the wing and neck pieces, then roast in the oven for 30 minutes.
- Remove the turkey from the oven and baste with the cooking juices.
- 7. Reduce the oven temperature to 160C/150C Fan/Gas 3.
- Pour the water into the roasting tray, then return the turkey to the oven and continue to cook for 1 hour, basting with the cooking juices every 20 minutes.
- Check the turkey is cooked by inserting a skewer into the thickest part of its thigh; if the juices run clear, the meat is cooked.
 Alternatively, use a meat thermometer; if

- cooked, the temperature should be 65C for 10 minutes, or up to 74C for 2 minutes.
- 10. Remove the turkey from the oven and transfer the bird to a large, deep-sided tray, reserving the roasting tray the turkey was cooked in along with the cooking juices. Set the turkey aside to rest for a minimum of 30 minutes and up to 1½ hours.
- 11. While the turkey is resting, cook your roast potatoes and vegetable dishes.
- 12. When you're almost ready to serve, return the roasting tray used to cook the turkey to the stove top. Bring the cooking juices to the boil over a medium heat.
- Collect the juices released by the turkey as it was resting and add them to the gravy. Season, to taste.
- Reduce the heat until the gravy is simmering, then stir in the dissolved corn flour and cook until the gravy has thickened.
- Strain the gravy through a fine sieve into a warmed jug.

Mushroom, chestnut & cranberry tart



Ingredients

- 230 g plain flour
- 60 g margarine
- 60 g vegetable shortening

FILLING:

- 1 large onion
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 5-6 carrots , (450g)
- 250 g chestnut mushrooms
- 360 g peeled chestnuts
- olive oi
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 225 g cream cheese
- 250 g wild mushrooms
- fresh flat-leaf parsley, (15g)
- 2 tablespoons garlic oil
- · 2 tablespoons dried cranberries

REDCURRANT GRAVY:

- 1 tablespoon walnut oil, or garlic oil
- 1 tablespoon redcurrant jelly

- 300 ml hot vegetable stock
- 1 heaped tablespoon cornflour, mixed with 2 tbsp water

Method

Preheat the oven and a large baking tray to 180°C/350°F/gas 4.

Start by making the pastry. Sift the flour and into a food processor, add the margarine, vegetable shortening and a pinch of sea salt, and pulse until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. If you don't have a food processor, place the ingredients in a large mixing bowl and cut together with the flat of a knife.

Add 2 tablespoons of cold water, pulsing as you go until the mixture begins to pull together to form a dough.

Tip the pastry into a large bowl and, using your fingertips, pull together into a ball. Knead lightly for about 2 minutes or until smooth and elastic.

Shape the pastry into a ball and place between 2 large sheets of clingfilm, then roll it out into a circle slightly larger than the tart tin and no thinner than 3mm. Peel off the uppermost sheet of clingfilm and carefully flip the pastry into a deep 23cm tart tin. Peel away the remaining clingfilm and gently press the pastry into the sides of the tin. Trim the edges and set aside.

Finely chop the onion, crush the garlic, then finely grate the carrots. Trim the stalks from the chestnut mushrooms and slice into rounds. Halve 240g of the chestnuts (the rest will be used for the topping).

Heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil in a heavy-based frying pan until hot, add the onions and cook gently over a low heat until softened. Add the carrots, garlic, thyme and mushrooms, and fry gently until softened and all of the liquid from the mushrooms has been absorbed – around 10 minutes.

Stir in the cream cheese and halved chestnuts and mix together gently until the cheese has softened and formed a creamy mixture. Season to taste, spoon the filling into the pastry case then level the top.

Place the tart on the baking tray on the top shelf of the oven and the potatoes on the bottom shelf. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes or until the pastry is crisp.

Remove the tart from the oven, cover loosely in foil to retain its heat and set aside.

For the gravy, heat the walnut oil and redcurrant jelly in a small saucepan, stirring until melted and smooth. Add the hot stock, bring to a simmer and stir in the cornflour. Simmer gently and stir continuously until you have the desired consistency. Set aside.

Finally, tear the wild mushrooms into pieces, roughly chop the remaining chestnuts and finely chop the parsley. Heat the garlic oil in a heavy-based frying pan until hot, add the mushrooms and fry gently until softened. Stir in the chestnuts, cranberries and parsley, and spoon over the tart to form a decorative layer. Reheat the gravy and serve with the tart.



Chocolate, marmalade and ginger steamed pudding

INGREDIENTS

- 175g unsalted butter, softened, plus extra to grease
- 1/2 cup (170g) marmalade
- 50g crystallised ginger, plus 2tbs ginger syrup
- 1 1/4 cup (175g) plain flour
- 45g cocoa powder
- · 2 tsp baking powder
- 175g caster sugar
- 3 large eggs, lightly beaten
- 1/3 cup (80ml) milk
- · Custard or ice cream, to serve

METHOD

- Generously grease a 1.2L pudding basin with butter and line the base with a circle of baking paper. Butter a large square of foil.
- 2. Spoon the marmalade into the base of the pudding basin and set aside.
- Using a fork or balloon whisk, whisk the flour, cocoa, baking powder and a pinch of salt together in a bowl.
- 4. In a mixing bowl or the bowl of a stand mixer with the paddle attachment, beat the butter and sugar together until pale and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs, adding a little of the flour mixture if it starts to curdle. Stir in the flour mixture and enough of the milk to form a soft dropping consistency. Fold in the chopped ginger.
- 5. Spoon mixture into the basin and smooth the top. Make 2 pleats in the centre of prepared foil, place buttered- side down and secure with string around the rim. Place an upturned saucer in a large pan and place basin on top. Pour in enough boiling water to come one- quarter way up the side of the basin. Cover with a lid and simmer for 1 hour 45 minutes, topping up with more boiling water if needed.
- Carefully remove the basin from the pan, run a knife around the sides to loosen and invert onto a plate. Serve with custard or ice cream.

Prawn Cocktail trio



- Chilli Prawn Cocktail
- 75ml tomato ketchup
- · 60ml chilli sauce
- 1 heaped tbsp prepared horseradish
- · Good squeeze of lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 tsp Tabasco
- 35-40 peeled, cooked & de-veined prawns
- Fresh parsley to serve (optional)
- 10 Appetizer style spoons (Chinese soup spoons)

Mix the sauce ingredients together in a small bowl and taste to check it is to your liking. Adjust as necessary then set aside.

Reserve 10 prawns then cut the remaining ones prawns into 2 or 3 pieces (optional – see above) and put in a bowl.

Spoon over enough of the sauce to coat the prawns without being too much! Keep any left over sauce in the fridge.

When ready to serve simply put some of the prawns onto each spoon then top with 1 of the reserved whole prawns.

Prawn Cocktail

- 8 tbsp good mayonnaise
- · 3 tbsp tomato ketchup
- · Splash of brandy
- 1/2 lemon
- · pinch of cayenne pepper
- Salt & Pepper
- 25-30 peeled, cooked and de-veined prawns (roughly 2-3 per person)

Lettuce leaves to serve – endive works well but you can use anything you like

Mix all of the sauce ingredients together in a small bowl. Taste to check the seasoning and whether it needs any extra lemon and adjust as needed.

Cut the prawns into 2 or 3 pieces and put in a bowl. Spoon over enough of the sauce to thickly coat the prawns without being too much!

When ready to serve put an individual lettuce leaf on each plate then top with a good spoonful of the prawn mixture. Finish with a light sprinkling of extra cayenne pepper and if you like a wedge of lemon.

Mexican Prawn Cocktail

- 125ml tomato juice
- 1 tbsp ketchup
- juice of 1/2 orange, freshly squeezed
- · juice of 1 lime
- · 2 tsp grenadine
- 2 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tsp Tabasco
- salt and pepper
- 1 tbsp Tequila
- 1 avocado
- 1/4 English cucumber
- 2 spring onions, finely chopped
- · 4 cherry tomatoes, quartered
- ½ jalapeno chilli, finely chopped (or if you like it hot use ½ habanero or Scotch Bonnet)
- 2 tbsp coriander, finely chopped, plus extra leaves for garnish
- 30 peeled, cooked and de-veined prawns

Start by making the sauce by combining everything together in a jug. Taste to check the balance of flavours and adjust if necessary to suit your tastes. Keep in the fridge until needed.

Cut the avocado in half and remove the stone, then finely chop the avocado flesh and pop into a bowl. Cut the piece of cucumber in half lengthwise and using a teaspoon remove the seeds and discard.

Cut each piece of cucumber into 4 pieces lengthwise then finely chop. Add to the bowl with the avocado then add the finely chopped spring onions, tomatoes, chilli and coriander.

Give everything a mix then cut the prawns into 2 or 3 pieces and add to the avocado and cucumber mix. Pour over enough sauce then spoon the mixture into 10 shot glasses. If needed top up with a little extra of the sauce. Serve garnished with an extra coriander leaf and if you like a wedge of lime. Delicious!

Poinsettia Cocktail



- Ingredients
- 25ml triple sec
- 50ml cranberry juice
- 75ml champagne or prosecco
- 1 freshbay leaf or sprig of rosemary, to garnish

METHOD

STEP 1

Chill the triple sec, cranberry juice, champagne and a martini glass in the fridge until cold.

STEP 2

Pour the triple sec and cranberry juice into the chilled glass, then slowly top up with the champagne and garnish with the bay leaf.

Vegan Gingerbread Christmas Trifle



Ingredients (Servings: 15)

For the cake:

- 350 g plain (all-purpose) flour
- 300 g brown or coconut sugar
- · 2tsp baking powder
- 2tsp ground cinnamon
- 2 tsp ground ginger
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- 360 ml plant-based milk
- 180 ml sunflower oil
- 1.50 Tbsp apple cider vinegar

For the gingerbread men cookies:

- 250 g plain (all-purpose) flour, plus more for dusting
- 60 g vegan butter
- 100 g brown or coconut sugar
- 60 ml maple syrup
- 3 Tbsp water
- 1 Tbsp ground chia or flax seeds
- · 2 tsp cinnamon, to taste
- 2 tsp ginger, to taste
- 1 tsp nutmeg
- 0.50 tsp bicarbonate of (baking) soda

For the frosting:

- 60 g icing sugar
- 1 Tbsp plant-based milk
- For the custard:
- 1 litre soy milk
- 50 g coconut sugar

- 80 g cornflour (cornstarch)
- · For the cream:
- 3 x 400g tins of coconut cream, refrigerated overnight
- · 2tsp vanilla extract

To decorate:

 2 punnets of strawberries or raspberries, blueberries or seasonal fruit, chopped

Method

- For the cake, make it 1-2 days before serving: preheat the oven to 160°C/Gas Mark 3. Line a 20cm (8in) cake tin.
- Mix the dry ingredients in a large bowl until there are no lumps. Add the wet ingredients and mix until combined. Pour into the tin and bake for 40-50 minutes or until an inserted skewer comes out clean. Cool in the tin for 20 minutes, then remove and cool on a wire rack.
- 3. For the cookies (also make in advance): add the ingredients to a large mixing bowl or food processor. Mix until a smooth dough forms. Add a little water if it's too dry. Chill in the fridge for 30 minutes.
- 4. When ready to roll out, preheat the oven to 180°C/Gas Mark 4. On a lightly floured surface, roll out the dough to about 8mm thick. Use cookie cutters to cut out shapes. Place the cookies on a lined baking tray with a little space between each. Repeat until you have no more dough. Bake for 10-12 minutes. The edges of the cookies should be slightly golden brown. Let the cookies cool completely.

- 5. For the frosting, mix the icing sugar and milk in a bowl. Add more sugar or milk to get the consistency needed. Use a fine-tip piping bag to decorate some of the cookies as desired. Let the icing set and set aside.
- 6. For the custard (make in advance): add the ingredients to a heavy-based saucepan. Bring to a boil for 10 minutes, then reduce to a simmer while constantly stirring. Simmer until it thickens to a pourable consistency (it thickens when it cools). If there are lumps, blend using a stand or handheld blender. Set aside in the fridge.
- 7. For the coconut cream (on the day of assembly): remove the tins from the fridge and scoop out the thick part at the top. You need about 800ml thick coconut cream. Put the cream in a large bowl or stand mixer. Add the vanilla, then use the mixer's balloon attachment or electric beaters to whip the cream until soft peaks form. Set aside in the fridge.
- 8. To assemble the trifle: use a serrated knife to slice the cake in half. If the dish is smaller or larger than the cake, break up the cake into chunks. Set aside.
- 9. If the custard has solidified, use a blender on it until it is soft again.
- 10. Scatter half the cake in the bottom of the trifle dish and press down to form an even layer. Arrange the cookies in the dish to lean on the glass sides. Layer the trifle with half the custard, half the whipped cream and half the fruit. Repeat layering. Top with the decorated cookies. Serve immediately.

International Volunteers Day 2021



High Priestess

The High Priestess sits in front of a thin veil decorated with pomegranates. The veil represents the separate conscious and subconscious realms, the seen and the unseen, and serves to keep casual onlookers out. Only the initiated may enter. The pomegranates on the veil are a symbol of abundance, fertility and the divine feminine, and are sacred to Persephone who ate a pomegranate seed in the underworld and was forced to return every year.

On either side of the High Priestess stand two pillars, marking the entrance to this sacred, mystical temple One pillar is black with the letter B (Boaz, meaning 'in his strength') and the other is white with the letter J (Jachin, meaning 'he will establish'). The black and white colours of the pillars symbolise duality – masculine and feminine, darkness and light – stating that knowledge and acceptance of duality are required to enter this sacred space.

The High Priestess wears a blue robe with a cross on her chest and a horned diadem (or crown), both a symbol of her divine knowledge and her status as a divine ruler. In her lap, she holds a scroll with the letter TORA, signifying the Greater Law. It is partly covered, signifying that this sacred knowledge is both explicit and implicit, it will only be revealed when the student is ready to look beyond the material realm. The crescent moon at her feet symbolises her connection with the divine feminine, her intuition and subconscious mind, and the natural cycles of the moon.


High Priestess Reversed
